What is this study about?

We are conducting a study exploring autistic people and their family carers' experiences of a range of services across Europe and beyond.

We also want to know if there are key differences in service access and quality between European countries.

Findings from the study will be used to shape a policy brief document addressing the need to improve service availability and accessibility for autistic people across Europe.
